Gwerthusiad annibynnol

Taith: adroddiad interim

Mae gwerthusiad interim o Taith gan yr ymchwilwyr cymdeithasol ac economaidd [Wavehill](#) wedi datgelu effaith gref y rhaglen ledled Cymru, yn enwedig ymhlith grwpiau heb gynrychiolaeth ddigonol. Mae'r adroddiad yn

dangos bod 44% o'r cyfranogwyr yn dod o'r cefndiroedd hyn—gan ragori ar y targed o 40%—gan amlygu ffocws Taith ar hygyrchedd a chynhwysiant. Mae'r rhaglen wedi ymgysylltu â 98 o wledydd ac mae'n agos at gyrraedd ei nod o 50 o bartneriaethau hirdymor, gyda 48 eisoes ar waith.

Mae'r galw am Taith wedi rhagori ar ddisgwyliadau, gyda diddordeb ac ymgysylltiad mewn cyfnewid rhyngwladol ar draws pob sector yng Nghymru yn parhau i dyfu.

Mae ysgolion wedi gweld manteision uniongyrchol. Galwodd staff yn Ysgol Pen-y-Bryn hi'n "un o'r cronfeydd gorau" maen nhw wedi'i dderbyn, tra bod athrawon yn Ysgol Gynradd Tan-y-Lan wedi tynnu sylw at ei heffaith ddiwylliannol ar ddisgyblion. Canfu'r gwerthusiad fod Taith yn cynnig gwerth da i ragorol am arian ac yn trawsnewid bywydau ledled Cymru.

Mae sefydliad newydd pwerus ym maes ieuenctid, [Our Voice Our Journey](#) (OVOJ), wedi lansio yng Nghymru gyda chenhadaeth feiddgar a diffuant: i roi llwyfan i leisiau ifanc a herio materion dwfn fel casineb at fenywod, trais ar sail rhywedd, ac anghydraddoldeb. Ond nid dim ond menter arall yw OVOJ, mae'n ganlyniad taith sy'n newid bywydau a sbardunodd fudiad dros newid parhaol. Dechreuodd y syniad yn ystod cyfnewid a ariannwyd gan Taith gyda [She Is Not Your Rehab](#), mudiad gwaelodol yn Seland Newydd sy'n helpu dynion i wella o drais a thrawma. Ym mis Hydref 2024, teithiodd wyth oedolyn ac wyth o bobl ifanc o ddau grŵp ieuenctid Cymru ar draws y byd, gan ddysgu sut y gall adrodd straeon, diwylliant, a chysylltiad sbarduno trawsnewidiad go iawn. "Roedden ni'n gwybod na fyddai popeth yn gorffen yno," meddai'r sylfaenydd Anne-Marie Lawrence. "Plannodd y daith honno had ... roedden ni'n gwybod

bod yn rhaid i ni wneud mwy.”

Taith's independent evaluation: interim report

An interim evaluation of Taith by social and economic researchers [Wavehill](#) has revealed the programme's strong impact across Wales, particularly among underrepresented groups. The report shows that 44% of participants come from these backgrounds—exceeding the 40% target—highlighting Taith's focus on

accessibility and inclusion. The programme has engaged with 98 countries and is close to reaching its goal of 50 long-term partnerships, with 48 already in place.

Demand for Taith has surpassed expectations, with interest and engagement in international exchange across all sectors in Wales continuing to grow.

Schools have seen first-hand benefits. Staff at Ysgol Pen-y-Bryn called it “one of the best funds” they’ve received, while teachers at Tan-y-Lan Primary highlighted its cultural impact on pupils. The evaluation found that Taith offers good to excellent value for money and is transforming lives across Wales.

Taith Stories

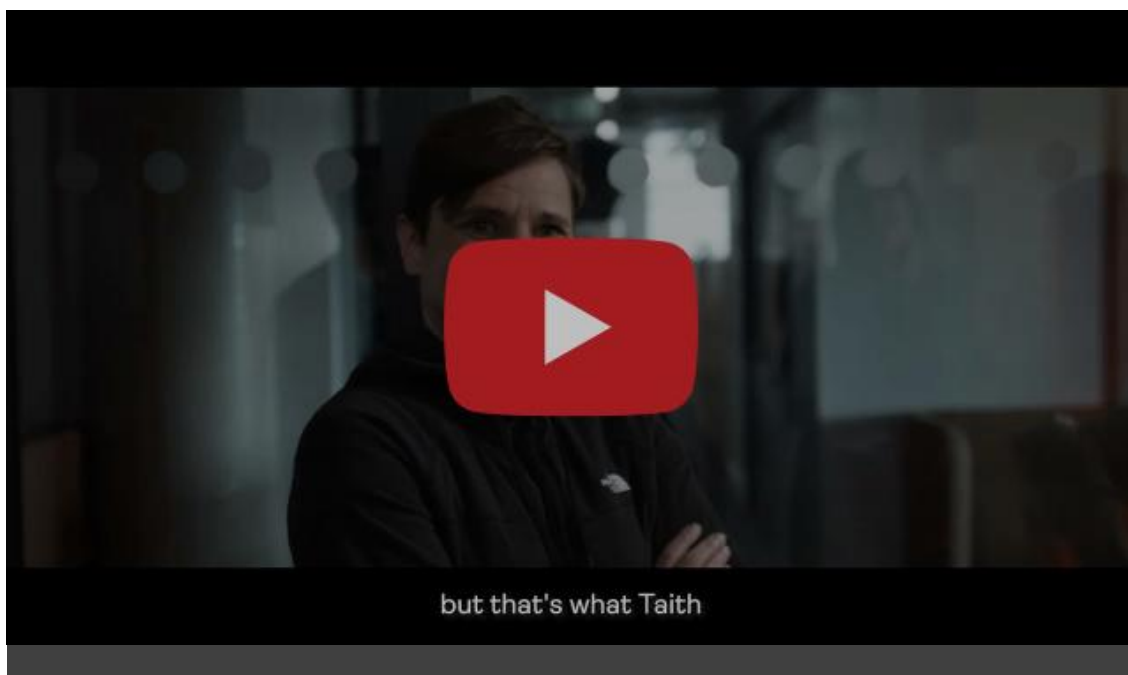
A powerful new youth-led organisation, [Our Voice Our Journey](#) (OVOJ), has launched in Wales with a bold and heartfelt mission: to amplify young voices and challenge deep-rooted issues like misogyny, gender-based violence, and inequality. But OVOJ isn't just another initiative, it's the result of a life-changing journey that sparked a movement for lasting change.

The idea was born during a Taith-funded exchange with [She Is Not Your Rehab](#), a grassroots movement in New Zealand helping men heal from violence and trauma. In October 2024, eight adults and eight young people from two Welsh youth groups travelled across the world, learning how storytelling, culture, and connection can drive real transformation.

"It was never meant to end there," said founder Anne-Marie Lawrence. "That journey planted a seed ... we knew we had to do more."

Now a growing force, OVOJ is helping young people reimagine the world around them, giving them the tools, confidence, and courage to rebuild it together.

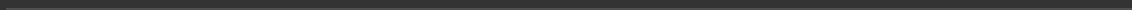
